Beginning with Ash Wednesday on February 13, we Christians of the western calendar enter the challenges presented by the season of Lent. Our community of pilgrimage here at **Crescent hill Baptist** Church will center our journey with the words "Heart Cries; Hard Words." Congregants will note a certain starkness in décor as we prepare the sanctuary for the transforming

reflection of the season. The first Sunday in Lent will bring down the bells, bright ribbons and banner days, all to be stored away for the season as our way of letting the Alleluia fall silent for a fallow period. The first candle of the Lenten wreath will be snuffed. Each subsequent Sunday will increase the darkness, and the altar table will be marked with a symbol of the hard times and hard words on the way to

Gethsemane on Maundy Thursday, March 28, Golgotha and Good Friday on March 29. In addition to exploring this theme in worship, we will be exploring Job's heart cries and hard words on Wednesday evenings during Lent. Bill Thomason will lead us through the book of Job. Heart cries and hard words are heard all throughout the Book of Job, which is about a good man who lost everything for no apparent reason.

32ND ANNUAL DIVORCE RECOVERY WORKSHOP

Thirty-two years ago, Crescent Hill Baptist Church recognized a need in the community, and the Louisville Divorce Recovery Support Group was created. Meeting regularly on Sunday evenings, the group is available for support and encouragement to those who are recently separated or divorced, or divorced for some time.

In addition to weekly gatherings, the 32nd annual Divorce Recovery workshop is offered on four Sunday evenings, from February 10, through March 3. Presented by the Louisville Divorce Recovery Group, the workshop runs from 5:00 to 7:30 PM at Crescent Hill Baptist Church.

Panel discussions, guest speakers and a breakout session will highlight the four week workshop.

★Kerri Richardson will open each meeting, welcoming participants and announcing the evening's agenda.

★ Jim Holladay, pastor of Lyndon Baptist Church and Ed Causey, a pastoral counselor, will speak the second week on the spiritual and psychological aspects of divorce, with a helpful Q&A period at the end. ★ The third week entails break-out sessions which allow participants to attend two discussions on a variety of topics. Counselors Chuck Leach and Michael Taylor are two of the speakers. Jeff Twyman, Master of Divinity and Jason and Kate Crosby will share their wisdom and experience, as well.

★ The final week of the workshop will end on a hopeful note, with a panel of support group members who have navigated divorce and are well on their way to recovery and renewal. They will discuss their personal experiences in redefining their "life as a single." This session will be moderated by Wade Rowatt, Professor of Pastoral Care and Counseling at Baptist Seminary of Kentucky.

All those interested in attending should arrive early to register in the Birchwood lobby. The cost for all 4 evenings is \$20; however, the fee is waived for those who cannot afford it. Childcare is provided for children up to 5^{th} grade.

If you also recognize a need or feel this may be helpful, please pass this valuable information to family and friends who are separated or divorcing. They will receive support and encouragement for their own recovery and renewal.

COOPERATIVE BAPTIST FELLOWSHIP NOMINATES NEW COORDINATOR

Suzii Paynter, the first woman to serve as director of the Baptist General Convention of Texas Christian Life Commission, has been nominated as third executive coordinator of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship.

A pastor's wife, Paynter is a past member of the CBF Coordinating Council and worked as a volunteer to co-chair the group's second General Assembly. A graduate of Baylor University with master's degrees from Stephen F. Austin University and the University of Louisville, she was elected head of the Texas CLC in 2006. Before that she served five years as the agency's citizenship and public policy director.

Paynter served 25 years as a national literacy professional, professor and consultant. She is a frequent teacher and ordained deacon at First Baptist Church in Austin, where her husband, Roger, is pastor.

Her nomination follows a year-long search to find a successor to Daniel Vestal, who led the moderate Baptist organization formed in 1991 for 16 years before retiring last summer.

The CBF Coordinating Council is scheduled to vote on her nomination at the group's upcoming meeting Feb. 21-22. Introduction of a new chief executive is expected to be a highlight of this year's CBF General Assembly, which meets June 26-28 in Greensboro, N.C.

Suzii and Roger were members at Crescent Hill Baptist Church while Roger was studying at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary from 1972-1975.

CHBC TO PARTICIPATE IN MARTHA STEARNS MARSHALL MONTH OF PREACHING

Since 2007, Baptist Women in Ministry has invited Baptist churches to participate in the Martha Stearns Marshall Month of Preaching by having a woman preach during the month of February. Rev. Brittani Bair will be preaching at Crescent Hill Baptist on Sunday morning, February 3.

This annual preaching month is named for Martha Stearns Marshall, an eighteenth-century Separate Baptist woman. Separate Baptists emphasized evangelistic preaching, boisterous worship services, and emotional conversion experiences. They were also known for a greater openness to women's leadership, having deaconesses, eldresses and even those who preached and prayed in public worship.

Martha converted to Christianity along with her husband Daniel during the First Great Awakening, and they were introduced to Baptist beliefs on moving to Virginia. Concluding that scripture taught believer's baptism, they were soon baptized, joined a Baptist church, and Daniel was licensed to preach. But both Marshalls were preachers, and Martha's zeal apparently equaled that of her husband. In 1755, the Marshalls, along with Martha's brother Shubal Stearns, moved to Sandy Creek, North Carolina, where they established what became the most influential Separate Baptist church in the South, and Martha often preached alongside Shubal at church meetings. As they moved, they founded Baptist churches in North Carolina and Georgia.

In all these churches, Martha provided excellent leadership, and in 1810, Virginia Baptist historian Robert Semple wrote: "Mr. Marshall had a rare felicity of finding in this lady a Priscilla, a helper in the gospel. In fact, it should not be concealed that his extraordinary success in the ministry is ascribable in no small degree to Mrs. Marshall's unwearied, and zealous co-operation."


